PASTOR'S CORNER

POPE BENEDICT XVI ON WAITING

"Every one of us, therefore, especially in this season which prepares us for Christmas, can ask himself: What am I waiting for? What, at this moment of my life, does my heart long for? And this same question can be posed at the level of the family, of the community, of the nation. What are we waiting for together? What unites our aspirations, what brings them together?

In the time before Jesus' birth, the expectation of the Messiah was very strong in Israel – that is, the expectation of an Anointed One, a descendent of King David, who would at last set the people free from every form of moral and political slavery, and find the kingdom of God. But no one would ever have imagined that the Messiah could be born of a humble girl like Mary, the betrothed of a righteous man, Joseph. Nor would she have ever thought of it, and yet in her heart, the expectation of the Savior was so great, her faith and hope were so ardent, that He was able to find in her a worthy mother. Moreover, God himself had prepared her before time. There is a mysterious correspondence between the waiting of God and that of Mary, the creature "full of grace" – totally transparent to the loving plan of the Most High.

Let us learn from her, the Woman of Advent, how to live our daily actions with a new spirit, with the feeling of profound expectation that only the coming of God can fulfill.

SAINTS OF ADVENT

Many know the story of St. Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, the old Indigenous farmer to whom Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared. He saw her four times. The final time, she offered proof of her presence through Castilian roses miraculously blooming in Mexico in December. But the proof was even more marvelous than that, as Juan Diego saw when he opened his cloak, which bore a stunning image of the apparition. It isn't often mentioned that Juan Diego was too busy for Mary; he was actually trying to avoid her. His uncle was very sick and Juan was rushing to find a priest, so to avoid being delayed by the Blessed Mother, Juan went by a different route. This is when she spoke that famous line, "Am I not here who am your mother?" Juan Diego listened and obeyed, trying to trust in the Blessed Mother even as he continued to worry about his uncle. And when he finally went home, he saw his uncle perfectly healthy - Mary had appeared to him in Juan Diego's absence and brought him God's healing. How often do we, like Juan Diego, rush about our business thinking we need to save ourselves? How often do we worry not only that God won't answer our prayers but that following Him will make everything harder? Still He loves us. Still He offers Himself to us. And St. Juan Diego reminds us that God is gentle with us even when we refuse to make time for Him. On his feast day Dec. 12, take a step back from the noise of the season and re-evaluate...how can you refocus your Advent on the Christ child? What tasks can be set aside? Ask Our Lady of Guadalupe to be a mother to you now, as she was to Juan Diego and his uncle, too.



SCHOOL SAFETY

In light of the recent school shootings and the rising concern for the safety of the students and faculty, a School Security Site Assessment was completed by the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety, along with security assessments by the Abington and Philadelphia Police, and Montgomery County Emergency Management Team at the start of the school calendar year. All three services identified the targeted concern of limiting access to the school building. Since the school is connected to the church, it allows unimpeded access to the school. The recommendation was made to limit access to the school on weekends and to school personnel only, during school hours. This access will be through the main door only, and all visitors' access will be recorded. With these restrictions, the school main entrance will not be accessible for Masses or to enter the church. Entrance to the church for Mass will be by the front doors on Susquehanna Road, as well as the two side doors. We thank you for your patience and understanding!


